This interdisciplinary meeting is part of the cycle A World in Motion and is co-organized with the Council for Climate of Aix-Marseille University. This day is placed under the sign of the commitment of all actors to the climate emergency in the Mediterranean.

Indeed, the control of the climate crisis is the major challenge of the 21st century. It implies the synergy of multiple urgent actions: reduction of greenhouse gas emissions, mitigation of global warming and its effects, adaptation of housing and urban planning, revolution in the production of materials and energy.

> The first part of the day is devoted to the transdisciplinary scientific analysis of global warming and its environmental and societal consequences. The second part of the day is dedicated to concrete solutions - economic or social, individual or collective - to be implemented to avoid the worst degradation of the living conditions of the next generations.

What do we know?

The revelation of the intensity of global warming and the anticipation of its rapid worsening are based on observations and measurements of the dynamics of the atmosphere, the ocean, the cryosphere and the biosphere. In this first part, specialists from these disciplines will present results accumulated over several decades that prove that the combustion of hundreds of billions of tons of fossil carbon is at the origin of the global warming of more than 1°C for a century, a climate degradation that is accelerating and whose consequences violently affect the Mediterranean area.


